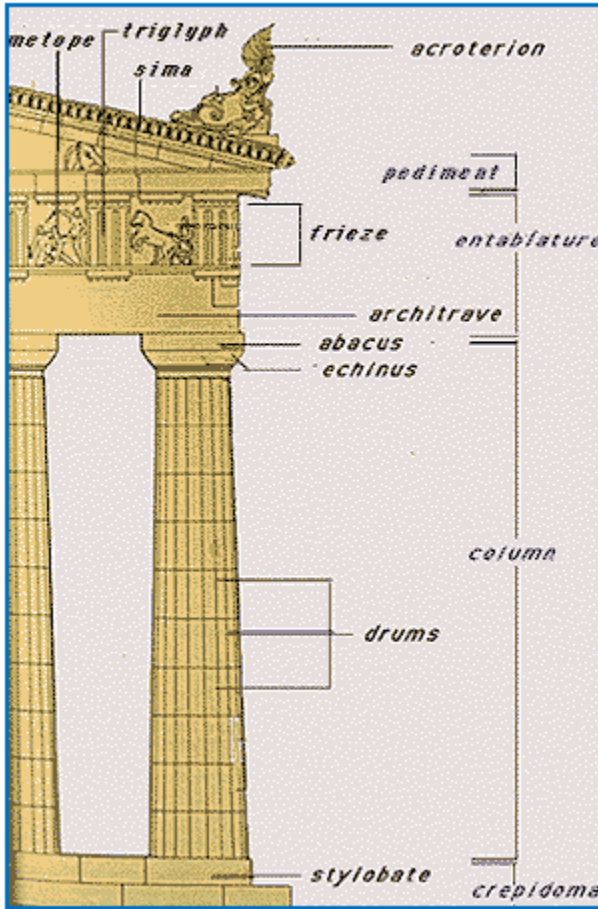
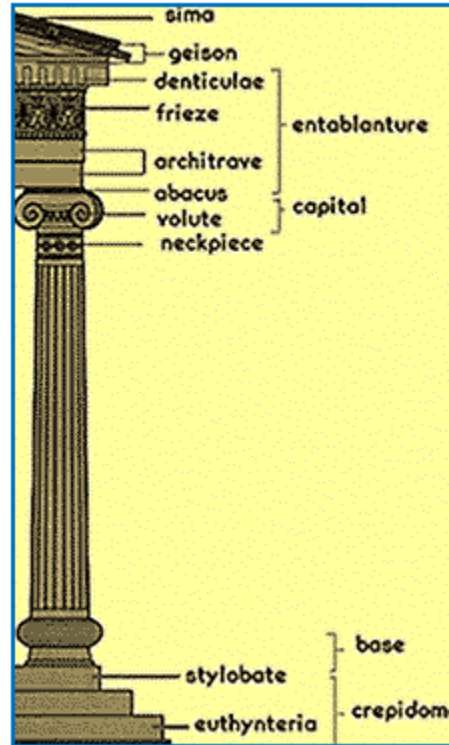




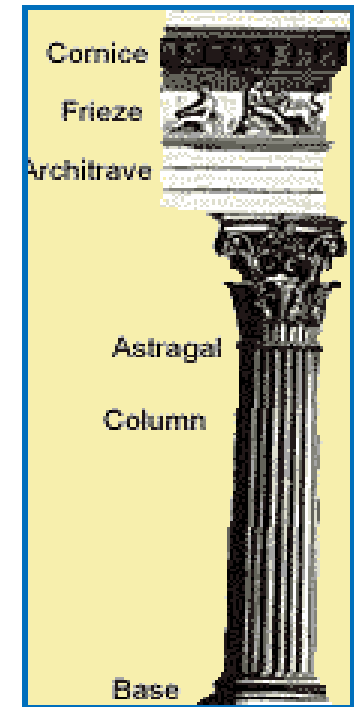
# COLUMNAR ORDERS



- DORIC -**
- Simplest of the 3 orders
  - Plain CAPITAL, consisting of an abacus & echinus
  - Simple column with parallel concave FLUTES
  - The PARTHENON uses Doric Columns



- IONIC -**
- Capital is more decorated than with Doric Order. Main feature are the VOLUTES.
  - Column sits on a base (unlike Doric Order)
  - Temple of Artemis at Ephesus uses the Ionic Order.



- CORINTHIAN -**
- Invented by the architect Callimachus
  - Capital is marked by stylized ACANTHUS leaves
  - Slender columns

- OTHER ORDERS -**
- COMPOSITE: Volutes of Ionic combined with the Acanthus of the Corinthian
  - TUSCAN: Stocky ultra-simplified Roman version of the Doric Order.
  - CARYATID: sculpted female figure serving as a column.
